CITY OF ROSEBURG LIBRARY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES May 20, 2025

1. CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chair Elder called the regular meeting of the Roseburg Library Commission to order at 4:03 p.m. on May 20, 2025, at the Roseburg Public Library, 1409 NE Diamond Lake Blvd., Ste. 100, Roseburg, Oregon and electronically via Zoom.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Guyer moved to approve the April 15, 2025, minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tassano and approved with the following vote: Commissioners Bentley, Elder, Guyer, and Tassano voted yes. No Commissioners voted no. The motion passed unanimously.

5. BUSINESS FROM THE COMMISSION

Commissioner Tassano reported that the Friends of the Library next book sale is scheduled for June $5^{th} - 7^{th}$, setup begins on June 4^{th} at 2:00 p.m., and we are looking for volunteers.

7. <u>INFORMATIONAL</u>

A. Monthly Statistics

Director Wiley reported library use in April was status quo. There was a new line on page 3 of the statistics, New Items Snapshot, indicating the percentage of new adult nonfiction books checked out at a particular time (24% on May 2).

Digital materials accounted for 35% of circulation in April. There are about 500 digital magazine checkouts every month. Director Wiley renewed the digital magazine subscription with OverDrive for another year at \$2000. This is funded by the operating budget.

The library provided 200 grab-and-go craft kits at the Easter Egg Hunt sponsored by the Fire and Parks and Rec departments. Staff connected with 230 people at the YMCA healthy kids event on April 26.

Commissioner comments and questions included clarification of the criteria for assigning value to books and status of the sponsorship program.

Director Wiley clarified that the library adds approximately 300 new items to the collection every month, the value fluctuates based on the type of book, books get removed based on use and for being outdated or in poor condition, and the library has not received any donations this fiscal year for the sponsorship program.

B. Programming

Director Wiley reported there was a standing-room-only crowd at the Celtic harps program May 1, and 45 people attended the Oregon Black history program May 15. The final adult program of spring will be local author Betty Tamm at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, June 5.

Librarian Ropp reported the last of the spring season programs was in April, outreach at three schools this month was well attended, many kids now have library cards, staff distributed program flyers and free books, two kids showed up for the 6-18-month-old lap-sit group, and teen volunteering will be available this month.

Commissioner comments and questions included that the Friends of the Library received a \$100 donation and lots of positive feedback about the music program, and the speaker for Black History Month in Oregon was very knowledgeable and amazing.

Director Wiley clarified the speaker was encouraged to come back.

C. Summer Reading Program

Director Wiley reported the Summer Reading Program webpage is live at www.roseburgpubliclibrary.org. It will continue to be populated. Thank you to major sponsors: Mike and Barb Coen, Douglas County Cultural Coalition, Friends of the Roseburg Public Library, and State Library of Oregon.

The adult program consists of a reading log with 30 prompts. Each book logged equals one entry in the grand prize drawing of a yearlong membership to the YMCA of Douglas County. Adult participants are invited to write book reviews for one of eight prizes that will be displayed in the lobby glass case. Adults also will have a monthly survey or activity they will be invited to complete for a gift card to a local business.

Librarian Ropp reported about simplifying the reading log this year for easier tracking, prizes for book reviews, overview of the activity sheets and sponsors, grab-n-go craft kits, StoryWalk®, Lunchbox Express and outreach at Sunshine Park Apartments, storytime at Stewart Park begins the first week in June, summer programs for kids begin on June 17th and teens on June 19th, activities every week Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, performers on Tuesdays, Wildlife

Safari is coming on Harry Potter Day, and hula hooping performer will be at Stewart Park on June 20th.

Commissioner comments and questions included clarification whether books have to come from the library to qualify, can they be audiobooks, and reading aloud to a parent or sibling. The Ford Family Foundation has a Select Books program, and more information can be found at https://selectbooks.org/.

Director Wiley and Librarian Ropp clarified all books in all formats and reading to or being read to all count.

D. Staffing Update

Director Wiley reported Courtnie Nielsen started May 20 as a 10-hour/week Library Aide, and Samantha Robinson will start May 29 as a 4-hour/week Library Aide.

E. <u>Grants Update</u>


Director Wiley reported she had an excellent conversation with clients at the Umpqua Valley disAbilities Network about the American Library Association grant the library will deliver over the next year. She has a conversation scheduled with clients from Sunrise Enterprises on May 27, and there are two open sessions for the public to attend on Tuesday, June 3 at 11:30 a.m. and Thursday, June 19 at 6 p.m. RSVP is required for both.


