MINUTES

<u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> The meeting of the City of Roseburg Parks and Recreation Commission was called to order at 8:17 a.m. Wednesday, February 5, 2025, in the Third Floor Conference Room at City Hall, Roseburg, Oregon.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES:</u> Commissioner Bailey moved to approve the minutes of the October 2, 2024 Parks and Recreation Commission meeting. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Finlay and approved with the following vote: Chair Smith, Commissioners Bailey, Finlay, Grubbs, and Mogavero voted yes. No one voted no.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Playground Equipment Purchase – Brown Park: Ligon reminded the commission that the City was awarded a grant from the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (ORPD) for the construction of a playground and other improvements at Brown Park. Ligon said staff evaluated the quality, durability, and design of play equipment and amenities from several manufacturers. After the evaluations, play equipment manufactured by Landscape Structures, sold exclusively in Oregon by Ross Recreation Equipment, was chosen. Staff received quotes from Ross Recreation Equipment which included discounts for purchasing using the National Purchasing Partners (NPP) cooperative purchasing contract. Chair Smith questioned what type of surface will be used. Ligon replied it would be ForeverLawn like what was used at Beulah Park. Commissioner Finlay inquired about parking. Herinckx stated that in addition to the on street parking that is already there, a small lot will be added at the south end and will have ADA access to the playground. Commissioner Bailey asked how far back from W. Harvard would the playground be. Staff said it would be back on the new lot. Commissioner Grubbs inquired if Ross Recreation was a common supplier. Ligon said the City has used them since the Stewart Park playground remodel which was in 2010 and that playground is still holding up.

MOTION: Commissioner Grubbs moved to recommend to the City Council the purchase of play equipment and surfacing material from Ross Recreation Equipment in the amount of \$632,391.49 for the Brown Park Expansion Project, using the NPP purchasing contract. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bailey and approved with the following vote: Chair Smith, Commissioners Bailey, Finlay, and Grubbs voted yes. Commissioner Mogavero voted no.

ISSUE STATEMENT AND SUMMARY

The City received bids for the Stewart Park Tennis and Pickleball Courts project. The issue for the Commission is whether to forward a recommendation to the City Council to award the construction contract.

BACKGROUND

On February 13, 2023, City Council adopted Resolution No. 2023-05, authorizing and supporting the application for an Oregon Parks and Recreation Department Local Government Grant Program for the Stewart Park Tennis and Pickleball Courts project.

April of 2023, staff applied for and received grant funding through the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department Local Government Grant Program. Notice to Proceed was issued on November 16, 2023.

The project consists of removing the existing 11 outdoor tennis courts and install 8 new tennis courts and 10 pickleball courts with fencing, lighting and seating.

The project was advertised on February 20, 2025, bids were opened March 20, 2025. Four (4) bids were received and are outlined below.

FINANCIAL/RESOURCE ISSUES

The FY 2024-25 adopted Park Improvement fund includes \$1,300,000 for this project. Approximately \$2,524,895 in funding has been identified for this project, utilizing a combination of sources. Cost estimates and funding breakdowns are summarized in the following tables.

TIMING ISSUES

The Oregon Parks and Recreation Grant agreement requires the project to be completed by December 31, 2025, unless otherwise extended. If awarded, Notice to Proceed would be issued for May 19, 2025. The construction contract requires work to be completed by October 5, 2025. If the Commission provides a recommendation, it will be presented to City Council on April 28, 2025.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The lowest bidder submitted all required documentation and is considered responsive. Funds have been identified for the project. Therefore, staff recommends forwarding a recommendation to City Council to award the project to the lowest responsive bidder, JRT Construction for \$2,360,310.

Project Updates

The following is a brief status update of current Parks projects.

Brown Park

On February 24, 2025, Council authorized the purchase of playground equipment and surfacing material for the Brown Park Expansion Project. Playground equipment and surfacing material will be delivered in late summer. Construction is expected to start in late summer / early fall. Project completion is expected by the end of the year.

Fir Grove Soccer Field Turf Project

Field size, layout and site grading has been determined. Fir Grove is located within the floodway of the South Umpqua River. The consultant is currently reviewing the grading plan and hydraulic modeling to confirm a "No-Rise certification" using FEMA guidelines. Staff is anticipating submitting a grant application with Oregon Parks and Recreation Department in Spring of 2026 for partial project funding.

Legion Field Assignment to Douglas County Softball Association

Council approved the Assignment of the Legion Field Management and Operation Agreement and the Legion Field Turf License Agreement to Douglas County Baseball Association (DCBA). Staff is currently awaiting the IRS's review of DCBA's 501c3 application packet. Once Federal approval is completed, the Assignment can be finalized.

Sunshine Trails

On December 2, 2024, both City and County Planning Commissions held a joint public hearing to consider bringing 49.92 acres of park property into the UGB and inside the City limits. Planning Commission requested staff prepare findings of fact referring the request to Council with a recommendation that Council approve the UGB expansion and subsequent land use actions.

On February 10, 2015, Council approved Ordinance 3608 Amending the UGB, Annexing Property, Amending the Comprehensive Plan Map, Amending the City Zoning Map and Amending the Urban Growth Management Agreement (UGMA).

On March 19, 2025, the Douglas County Commissioners held a public hearing and approved Co-Adoption of the Amendments. The 21-day appeal period ended on Wednesday, April 9, 2025.

UACT Renovation Project

UACT is currently working on submitting for site plan review. Once plan review comments are received UACT will proceed with design work.
