ORDINANCE NO. 388
AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING SECTION 7.02.100 OF THE ROSEBURG MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, Chapter Revised Statute 100.530 requires, "Any city or county law that involves the sale of alcohol, liquor, drinking or keeping same and the violation of public property that is open to the public must be explicitly reasonable as to time, place and manner with regard to persons experiencing homelessness; and

WHEREAS, ORS 100.530 becomes effective July 1, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the City of Roseburg desires to update the Roseburg Municipal Code Section 7.02.100 to meet the statutory requirements in order to OODT 100.530 by balancing the public property for its intended use, and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF ROSEBURG ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Revised Municipal Code Section 7.02.100, titled "Prohibited Camping" is hereby repealed and replaced to read as follows:

7.02.100 Prohibited camping:

A. As used in this Section:

- "Camping" or "Camping" means to pitch, erect, leave, or occupy campsite for the purpose of habitation, as evidenced by the use of camp materials;
- "Campsite" means a location upon City Property where Camping Materials are located;
- "Camping Materials" include, but are not limited to, personal property, including, but not limited to, tents, awnings, hammocks, furniture, or outdoor cooking equipment similar items that are or may be stored or placed in use at any time;
- "City Property" means any real property or structure owned, leased, or managed by the City, including public property;
- "Unauthorized Person" means a person who enters, occupies, or uses any real property, or structure, or facility owned, leased, or managed by the City;
- "Public Property" means any street, road, alley, right-of-way, park, or public property, or facility owned, leased, or managed by the City;
- "Personal Property" means any item that can be identified as belonging to an individual and that can be removed from the area of safety.




