Dolly Parton's Imagination Library now is available to all young children living in Oregon.

The statewide expansion of the free book-gifting program is made possible by the State of Oregon and 57 community organizations. Our local program partner, Friends of the Roseburg Public Library, covers the Glide, Idleld Park, Roseburg, Wilbur and Winchester zip codes.

Another new feature: Families now have the option of receiving the standard English book collection or the new bilingual English/Spanish book collection.

Imagination Library mails one new book every month to registered children from birth to fifth birthday at no cost to families. Go to [www.imaginationlibrary.com](http://www.imaginationlibrary.com) and click "Check Availability" to get started. Alternately, register in person at the library.

### **Programs for Adults with Disabilities**

The library has finalized program dates for community members with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

At 11:30 a.m. the fourth Thursday of each month beginning Aug. 28 through April 23, there will be a movie screening and snacks. Registration is not required.

There will be no movies on Nov. 27 and Dec. 25.

At 11:30 a.m. the second Thursday of each month beginning Sept. 11 through April 9, there will be a special performer or hands-on activity. Registration at least two weeks before the event is requested in order to provide supplies for all participants.

On Sept. 11, Create & Sip Studio in Roseburg will teach a painting class. On Oct. 9, attendees will tie dye T-shirts and book bags.

Three 6 p.m. programs have been scheduled – Thursday, Oct. 16, Thursday, Jan. 15 and Thursday, April 2. Registration at least two weeks before the event is requested.
