The library also is in the final week of programs for the summer. Youth Services Librarian Aurora Ropp will work behind the scenes next month to plan fall programs, which begin in October. That leaves readers plenty of time to binge-read her Rebel Blue Ranch series of four books, beginning with "Done and Dusted." Get swept away by the saucy stories of Wyoming cowboys and the strong women who upend their lives.

Then check out Sage's newest book, "Soul Searching," dropping Sept. 30. Taking place just up the road from Rebel Blue Ranch, this one introduces Collins, who reluctantly returns to her hometown to help her family. She boards with and works for the newly arrived, hunky furniture upholsterer, Brady, who doesn't seem to have a problem with Collins' ability to talk to ghosts.
